Two other children live with grandmother in Kuala Lumpur. Costs include lunches at RM2/schoolday to ensure one proper meal a day.

COST TO SPONSOR RM 615

Father died recently, family live with widowed great grandmother and grandmother, welfare payment stopped as brother living at home, rent RM 300, no income, no transport - difficult to find work due to rural location. Costs include lunches at RM2/schoolday to ensure one proper meal a day.



NUR SYAZANA - 13 YEARS

NUR ADRIANA - 9 YEARS

COST TO SPONSOR RM 285

Father left 7 years' ago, live with parents (he deaf, she on mainland trying to find work) and mother's 3 brothers, mother minimal income, live in small boarded up part of a disused cafe. Kids bright.



FATIN - 13 YEARS

COST TO SPONSOR RM 728

Orphan being raised by her grandmother. She stays in school hostel to ensure extra tuition, regular meals, social interaction and to save costs at home.



LEELASHINI - 9 YEARS

COST TO SPONSOR RM 608

Lives with parents (both rubber tappers), younger sister and disabled elder brother. Family very poor living in dreadful conditions. Costs include lunches at RM2/schoolday to ensure one proper meal a day. Bright child who loves school!



MHD FIKRI - 14 YEARS

COST TO SPONSOR RM 755

Sorry - no pic of Mhd but this is his family

Lives with his parents, two siblings (one already sponsored) in family house. Father does contract work which is not regular, mother unable to work as cannot leave baby with her mother who suffers from blackouts. Mhd Fikri lives in school hostel to ensure extra tuition, regular meals, social interaction and to save costs at home.

Live with their parents and younger brother, father contract work (not regular) and mother who sews and does some private tuition.



SHARUNYA - 16 YEARS

Lives with parents, father contract work (not regular), mother sells homemade cakes. She and siblings extremely bright (brother studying to be a doctor, others at university). Family struggling to pay rent and cost of schooling kids. Sister taken large bank loan and also from loan shark. Exam year. Cost includes transport.



DURGA DEVI - 12 YEARS

COST TO SPONSOR RM 454

Lives with parents, grandfather and four siblings. Income low, other children already sponsored, first year at secondary school. Includes transport costs.



UMMI NAZDRAH - 8 YEARS

COST TO SPONSOR RM 290

Lives with parents - father rubber tapper, mother sells home made food - income RM 850, family have 3 children on mainland in further education and are struggling to keep up with schooling costs. Ummi is a bright child.



AFDLIN - 8 YEARS

COST TO SPONSOR RM 664

Live with their divorced mother and brother. They have a sister and brother who live on the mainland with their grandmother to ease the burden on the family budget. Mother works full time in housekeeping - averaging RM 650/month with rent of RM 250/month and supplements income with babysitting. Costs include lunches at RM2/schoolday to ensure one proper meal a day. Asyraff is in his last year at primary school and taking exams.

PLEASE NOTE: In the Government's recent budget it was announced that school fees would be waived next year for primary and secondary schoolchildren. There is unlikely to be clarity on the financial implications of this until December. As we have so many sponsored children to process ready for the new school year on January 3, we have had no alternative but to include school fees in our costings. Sponsors will receive a credit at the end of 2012 if the costs are less than we have allowed for.

The Government is also giving every schoolchild RM 100. This amount has not been deducted from costings as these families are so poor that any extra income they receive is a welcome bonus.
